TO: Portland Public Schools (PPS) Board of Directors

One-third of all students use TriMet for after

- 8 out of 10 students say they feel safe all the time traveling to and from school.
- x Another 15% feel safe some of the time and only 1% of students never feel safe. Feeling safe all the time ranges from a high of 86% at Wilson to 66% at Benson.
 - x The schools with the highest levels of reported ridership (Benson, Madison, and Franklin) also have the lowest ratings of feeling safe all the time (66%, 72%, and 75%, respectively).
 - o Males feel safer than females (84% vs. 76%), as well as White students (84%) compared to all other ethnic subgroups (70-78%).

When asked why they do not feel safe traveling to and from school, many responses involved contact with strange people and erratic behavior, often on the bus and/or Max.

- x Students also cited other reasons related to their neighborhood or TriMet stop feeling unsafe, especially at nighttime, or that people follow them off the bus/Max. Notably, a very specific fear involved stories of attempted abduction of themselves or friends.
